He was, by any definition, a remarkable man who, with a combination of religious zeal and hard nosed capitalism, managed to make Bushy Park the largest producer of hops in Australia as well as the southern hemisphere. After the congress, during your return flight from Tasmania you will get to know Sidney – which many praise as the most beautiful city.

The town is situated in the scenic, very charming Derwent River Valley. First settlers were immigrants from the 1807 discontinued branch on Norfolk Island;

they gave the area its name. Due to the old building stock, New Norfolk has been placed by the Natural Trust under protection of historic monuments. In the

Montagu Street reside the Old Colony Inn, built in 1835, and the Bush Inn, built in 1815, which holds the oldest liquor licence of Australia. Former competitors,

but nowadays beer will be tapped only at the Bush Inn. The Old Colony Inn now houses a museum showing early settler furnishings. The Oast House at Hobart

road was used from 1867 until 1969 for hop drying. It is now a Museum demonstrating hop growing history and an art gallery.

Hailed by beer lovers as the 'Jewel in the South', Australia's oldest brewery looks a lot like a castle. This may be because an Englishman, Peter Degraives, built it in 1824

HOBART/ PORTH ARTHUR - RICHMOND

Port Arthur is a small town and former convict settlement on the Tasman Peninsula. Port Arthur is one of Australia's most significant heritage areas and the open air museum is officially

Tasmania's top tourist attraction. Known for its harsh conditions, dark history and stark beauty, Port Arthur is located approximately 100 km south east of the state capital, Hobart. In 1996 it

was the scene of the worst mass murder event in post-colonial Australian history. Drive to historic Richmond, one of the first settlements of Tasmania. During the early years of settlement it

was an important garrison town and intermediary for the prisoner transports to Port Arthur. For this purpose, prisoners built in 1823 the first stone bridge of Australia, a passage which

helped Richmond expand very quickly. More than 50 buildings were erected during that time; all of them now under protection. Among them are the Bridge Inn, 5 years older than the

bridge, the courthouse and the prison, both from 1825. The Richmond Gaol, the biggest attraction, is situated next to the Richmond bridge. The cells are preserved just like the times where

prisoners were incarcerated for one night, before they had to continue their march in chains on to Port Arthur.

A farewell dinner will be presented to you in the noble roof restaurant of Wreast Point Casino. A splendid 3-course menu including 1 glass of champagne and a beautiful view across the

downtown area will make this an enjoyable evening.

Pick up by your coach from the hotel and trip to New Zealand Hops Ltd. to visit a processing plant. The company has supported a professional plant-breeding programme since the 1950s and, in 1986, became the first country in the world to commercially produce hops from triploid hop cultivars in response to international brewers' demand for seedless hops. Afterward travel to Upper Moutere to visit one of the hop farms. After lunch at a Winery you will go on to Motueka, about 30 min. drive away. Motueka remains a centre of the hop region. Hop planting in New Zealand began in the mid of 19. Century when the hop was introduced by European settlers. At this time hops was grown in entirely new Zealand but soon they discovered that area around Nelson brought the best income. Today New Zealand hop planting is a small export oriented industry with 26 hop-growing farmers which approximately 800 tonnes hops grow on approximately 350 hectares, mostly in the Nelson/Motueka area. Since 1980 the production increased from 281 tonnes to 833 tonnes in 1996. Almost the entire production, about 85%, is exported. The hop harvest usually starts at the beginning of March. Visit of a hop farm. Afterwards travel to Kaiteriteri to have afternoon tea at the Kaiteriteri Beach Shoreline restaurant. Return to the hotel.

Dinner with local hop growers at either Rutherford Hotel or other venue.
